Our Associate Pastor- Rev. Bayani Alkuino



Hello Sunnyvale UMC! I am so grateful to the Lord for giving me this opportunity to be your associate Pastor. So to tell you about myself, first is that I am a second generation church worker. My mother was a former deaconess appointed in the Southern Provinces in the Philippines. Then followed by me, where I started my ministerial journey serving our churches in the Rural Provinces of Leyte, Philippines.

I finished my Bachelors degree in Statistics in Visayas State College of Agriculture which is now Visayas State University (VSU). After graduation, I proceeded to get my Master of Divinity in Union Theological Seminary in Dasmarinas, Cavite Philippines. Then I also took, Bachelor of Science in Computer Science and reached up

to third year level before we left to migrate here in the US. I was a neighborhood Pastor in the slums of Manila, a mission Pastor in the rural communities of Leyte, an administrative Pastor in the biggest church in our District in the urban poor community of Cebu City, was appointed as District Superintendent for 2 years, an avid tennis player, a husband to Grace, a father to Blessy(17), Bryce(13) and Brynn(6), and most of all a servant of the Lord Jesus Christ.

My experience in the ministry was far from glamorous, it was full of challenges: people in poverty, people feeling hopeless, people oppressed, people questioning God why born in such hardship was my daily undertaking. And this is basically why I answered the call of the Lord to be in the ministry to share the Good News of the Lord.

Luke 4:18-19, "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

And this experience is so valuable to me because it shaped my mindset to what I am today. With the simple phrase to remind me that: "God is Able." Like coming here in the US from where I came from was next to impossible, but armed with the belief that "God is Able" surely gave us the motivation to struggle and never waver. And indeed we are now, a citizen of our great nation. Truly there is hope in the Lord.

Future Ministry

Living here in the US for more than ten years, made me realize that there is not much difference with where I came from. Differences could be buying power, economic life style, and individual potential are higher here in the US, but if we look closer to what is happening in our community we can see the similarity: people in poverty, people feeling hopeless, people seeking justice, people marginalized, people discriminated, people looking to God for answers. And this is what we want to be involved in. God is sending us to give hope to the hopeless, voice to the voiceless, and rest for the weary. This will not be a one man action but a community of faith mission to be involved in the plight of people in our immediate community. Individually we might be powerless, but together and with the Lord we will make a difference.

Lastly in Mark 16:15 says, "Go everywhere in the world, and tell the Good news to everyone." Our ministry will be for everyone who calls on us for help and probably wants to be helped. No one will be excluded whether in race, gender, political or religious affiliation, economic status, nationality, sexual orientation, age, and others. We all need God's grace, God's love and God's peace. Therefore everyone is welcome like our church motto: with Open hearts. Open Minds. Open Doors.
