Advent always seems to arrive too soon.

We're still catching our breath from Thanksgiving, and suddenly the lights go up, the carols start playing, and our calendars overflow. Every year I tell myself, *This time I'll slow down*. And then... I don't.

But maybe slowing down isn't the point.

Maybe Advent isn't asking us to escape the chaos — maybe it's inviting us to *find the sacred within it*. This year, our Advent worship follows *The Nutcracker*, that dreamlike tale of Clara's journey through fear and wonder. And if you find yourself surprised by joy — even in the smallest moment — that's where Christmas begins.



Hey, long time! SUMC recently added Venmo as an electronic donation method, so I'm taking this as an opportunity to talk about it and a few other ways that you can support our church activities and ministries.

Venmo is a smartphone app for sending (or receiving) money. SUMC's Venmo name is @GiveToSUMC. Venmo withholds a "1.9% + \$0.10" transaction fee for all charitable contributions, so for example, a \$100.00 Venmo donation sends \$98.00 to SUMC and Venmo keeps \$2.00.

The PayPal Giving Fund is a <u>no-fees browser-based way to use a computer, smartphone or tablet to send money</u> from your PalPay account to charities that have registered with the Fund. So far this year SUMC has received \$27,042. The URL for SUMC's PayPal Giving Fund webpage is <a href="https://www.paypal.com/us/fundraiser/charity/4706243">https://www.paypal.com/us/fundraiser/charity/4706243</a>, and it can be reached by clicking the "One Time Donation" box at <a href="https://sunnyvaleumc.org/give">https://sunnyvaleumc.org/give</a>.

SUMC's PayPal Donate webpage is a browser-based way to use a computer, smartphone or tablet to send money directly to SUMC; so far this year our church has received \$20,077. The URL for SUMC's page is <a href="https://www.paypal.com/donate/?hosted button id=BLBXGTD268FX2">https://www.paypal.com/donate/?hosted button id=BLBXGTD268FX2</a>, but an easier way to get there is by clicking the "Recurring Donation" box at <a href="https://sunnyvaleumc.org/give">https://sunnyvaleumc.org/give</a>. PayPal withholds a "1.99% + \$0.49" transaction fee; unlike Venmo, the fee amount is displayed on the webpage, so a donor can easily choose to add that amount to their donation. For example, with PayPal Donate you can pay \$100.00 to send \$97.52 to SUMC, or pay \$102.53 to send \$100.00 to SUMC.

- If you're at least 70.5 years old, you can tell your IRA Custodian to mail Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) checks from your IRA directly to SUMC.
- If you own a Donor Advised Fund (DAF), you can tell your DAF Custodian to mail donation checks from your DAF directly to SUMC.
- If your bank provides a "Bill Pay" service, you can tell them to write donation checks from your bank account and mail them directly to SUMC.
- And of course, even though we don't pass the offering plate through the pews anymore, you can still use the traditional donation methods of putting cash, coins, or personal checks in the offering plate. When you do the latter, please write your check to "Sunnyvale UMC". If you want your donation to go towards anything other than SUMC's ongoing expenses, please write your check to "Sunnyvale UMC" \*and\* write a note on it describing where you want your money to end up, and we'll make sure it gets there. Also, please do \*not\* put checks written to UMCOR or any other charity In the offering plate, because our bank may choose to return any check written to anything other than SUMC's official banking name.
